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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets.

January has been another quiet month for Voices Israel – one of those interim months where events are ongoing rather than starting or stopping. The most notable event of the month occurred right at its very end: our Reuben Rose Competition administrator, Mark Levinson, has just announced the winners of prizes and Honorable Mentions of the 2022 competition. Congratulations to them all! Everyone who entered the competition has been informed of the results, and we'll put out an email blast to all our members in the very near future. We hope that during February we'll be able to post a PDF of the full texts of the winning poems up on the website, as usual.

Meanwhile the submission period for the Voices Israel Anthology continues until March 15th, so you're all warmly invited to submit poems which didn't manage to place in the Reuben Rose Competition, and any other good poems you'd like to share with us (up to three poems in all), for publication in the Anthology. Remember that the *only* way to submit is online via Submittable – by clicking the Submit button at the bottom of the "Submitting To The Anthology" page of our website (https://www.voicesisrael.com/submitting-to-the-anthology). And do please read the submission guidelines, especially regarding maximum length of poems!

Our Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize competition is also still accepting submissions, until the end of February. Please keep advertising this competition: if you know any English teachers – your children's or grandchildren's; former or current colleagues; friends — do suggest it to them. Our announcement and the guidelines can be downloaded from the Voices Israel website (https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize).

And finally, during January we produced and printed the chapbook from our last workshop, held in Haifa in late November, and I've sent copies to everyone who ordered them. There are still a few left for sale if any of our members are interested, at the subsidized member price of 20 NIS (plus 5 NIS for postage if mailed to you).

Looking ahead: our next national meeting will be the Annual General Meeting which I hope we'll hold in person (not via zoom) towards the end of March or in early April; and after that, the joint prizegiving ceremony for the Reuben Rose and Bar Sagi Prize competitions. Since the 13 top Reuben Rose poems come from many poets abroad as well as in Israel, this latter event will most probably be held via Zoom, as it has for the past few years. Exact dates are still to be arranged.

And as always: our Workshop Coordinator, Elana Dorfman, is always happy to hear of ideas for new workshops. If you have a subject that you think would interest other members, or one that you'd like to hear a presentation on yourself – or if your local group has an idea for a workshop that it could organize – just get in touch with Elana at elanado@gmail.com.





THE BAR SAGI YOUNG POETS PRIZE

Deadline is the end of this month!

Bar Sagi was a young Israeli poet who wrote in English. Born in Rehovot in 2001, she lived from age five to eleven with her parents in the United States and English became her preferred language. Sadly, on her return to Israel she was diagnosed with bone cancer, and after putting up a courageous and protracted battle, finally succumbed in 2017 after over four years, before reaching her sixteenth birthday.

During these last years, Bar wrote 25 poems which documented her journey with illness and hope and her remarkable life force. These poems, written in her own hand-illustrated book entitled "See Me Soar and Spread My Wings," reflect her many-sided character and unusually mature understanding. The publishing house Gvanim has published them in a book, illustrated with original water-colourings mostly by Ellie Makar-Limanov with others by Anna Melnikov (available from Steimatsky). In addition, the Israeli Education Ministry has selected six of them to be taught in Israeli schools: these can be freely viewed and the file downloaded at

Bar's family decided to endow a prize in her name, to preserve her memory and to encourage other young poets. Voices Israel is delighted to partner with them in this initiative, and to help encourage the voices of the young in Israel.

The competition is open to Israelis aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written. Full submission rules and guidelines are at www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize-guidelines.

The competition is free to enter, and awards three cash prizes (First Prize: 400 NIS; Second Prize: 250 NIS; Third Prize: 100 NIS) plus a variable number of Honorable Mentions at the judges' discretion. The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if there are any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology.

The fourth Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize will remain open for submissions until the end of February 2023.

Cleaver: Philadelphia's International Literary Magazine is an online quarterly journal that is now holding a Form and Form-Breaking Poetry Contest. Show us your poems that hold up the perfect iambic pentameter of a Shakespearean sonnet or crash it on the rocks of free verse. Show us a villanelle with textbook patterning or show us the villanelle who just crashed her car. Submission fee is \$15 for one or two poems, \$10 for each additional poem. First prize is \$500, second prize is \$250; third prize is \$100.
