LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

This month brought us a mixture of joy and sorrow. We share in the general sorrow over the tragedy ongoing in Ukraine; we extend our condolences to the families of the victims of the recent terrorist attacks; and we mourn, on a more personal level, the passing on March 16th of our active Canadian member Ellen S. Jaffe, after a long battle with cancer. We rejoice in the fact that we could give her some joy before she died: on March 13th we held in her honour, via Zoom, a North American poetry reading, organized by our U.S. member Diane Ray, which Ellen attended from her hospital bed, together with her family and friends. Eight US, Canadian and Israeli Voices members each read two of Ellen's poems and one of their own. Ellen herself was thrilled that this happened and that she could attend, and her family also told us, after she passed away, how much the event had meant to her.

Back in Israel: we held our Annual General Meeting on March 29th, at the home of Jeannie Harrison, Phella Hirschson's daughter-in-law, near Tel Aviv University. Many thanks to Jeannie for her generous offer to host the event! Despite yet another wave of yet another Corona variant, and despite the current security situation, 13 people managed to come. At the AGM we said a fond farewell to Linda Suchy, our marvellous secretary, who has retired from the position after five years, with a small honorarium to show our appreciation for all she has done for Voices; and we welcomed Pesach Rotem who has taken over from her, after his nomination was officially confirmed by general vote at the AGM. Hard as it is to think that I shall no longer be in daily touch with Linda, whose efficiency and experience has been of such help to me, I look forward to working with Pesach going forward.

The AGM ended with an Open Mic at which nine members read one or two poems each.

Meanwhile fifteen poets sent in the poems they wrote or started at Elana Dorfman's "Poetry of Color" workshop of February 8th, and I finally found the time to produce an e-chapbook of the event (PDF document) and send it to all participants. I do hope you enjoy it! It is arranged for printing double-sided, so that if anyone wishes to print it and e.g. spiral-bind it, they can do that. For regular reading on the computer, however, it works best to view it as single pages. We are not putting it on the website since this counts as publication; but if any member of Voices wishes to receive a copy just send me an email, as usual to **president.voices@gmail.com**.

The submission period for the Bar Sagi Prize has just ended. See page 8 herein for the announcement and the results of the competition. The prize-giving event will be by Zoom on April 26th together with the awards event for the Reuben Rose Competition. A notice has been sent out to all members, and to all the Reuben Rose entrants and winners.

Finally, we're looking forward to holding the 2022 Netanya residential workshop, hopefully at the end of May. **If you have an idea for a workshop session for it, please, again, email me as above.**
