LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

This has been a month of celebrations – starting with the last few days of Passover, followed by Independence Day, and ending as I write this with Lag ba'Omer – which we hope will not cause the Corona restrictions to be resumed!

For Voices, the big news is that we have decided to hold the "Poetry by the Sea" residential workshop, which was postponed last year, at the King Solomon hotel in Netanya. A draft (not finalized) program is included in this newsletter. It is planned to take place on a Sunday-Monday, either May $30-31^{st}$, or the following week, June $6^{th}-7^{th}$. Attendance will require a "green passport".

The hotel will only give us a price quote after Shavuot, which means that **everyone will then have to register quickly! As soon as we have firm prices and date, we'll notify everyone.** We expect the price per person in a double room to be reasonably close to the 2016 price mentioned in our email message about it, 460 NIS; but please note that we mentioned the wrong price for a single room: back in 2016 it was 760 NIS not 580. I do hope this won't seriously affect those of our members who would prefer a single room.

Our other good news is that David Caplan, who gave a very successful workshop in Haifa in 2018, has agreed to be the International Judge of the 2021 Reuben Rose competition. David is a Professor of English at Ohio Wesleyan U. where he is also assistant director of creative writing. He has published two books of his own poetry, the latest in 2020, and serves as a contributing editor to the Virginia Quarterly Review and to Pleiades: A Journal of New Writing. We are delighted that he has accepted and look forward to a happy collaboration with him.

Meanwhile, our Annual General Meeting, held via Zoom on April 5th, had 27 attendees, including some of our overseas members. Fourteen of us read a poem each at the Open Mic which ended the meeting.

This Sunday we're holding the joint Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize and Reuben Rose competition awards event — again via Zoom. We have a record 63 people registered to attend — 26 of them for the Bar Sagi event though we hope they will stay for the Reuben Rose event too. I do encourage our own members who are attending the latter, to join the meeting from the start and give encouragement to these talented young poets, all of whom have told me how excited they are to have won a prize or honourable mention and to be taking part in the event.

Finally – our Haifa group recently held a poetry reading for the Haifa branch of Hadassah, organized by Wendy Blumfield, at which several of our members read their poems. We were encouraged to see that the Hadassah members greatly enjoyed it.

I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the Netanya workshop in a month's time!
