

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

CALLS FOR SUBMISSIONS

Palette Poetry is an online poetry journal with two open calls for submission. The Featured Poetry category spotlights a number of poems from new authors each month. It is open for submissions year-round, no deadlines. Submission is free, with options to pay for Quick Response or for Editorial Feedback if you so desire. They pay \$50 per poem selected. The Sappho Prize for Women Poets is a contest open to women poets only. The winning poet will be awarded \$3,000 and publication on Palette Poetry. Second and third place will win \$300 and \$200 respectively, as well as publication. The entry fee is \$20 to submit up to three poems. The deadline is June 19. Guidelines for both submission categories are at www.palettepoetry.com/submit/.

Poetry London is a print poetry journal that publishes thrice yearly. It is based in London but open to submissions from around the world. For **regular submissions**, there is no submission fee and no deadline. They pay £30 per accepted poem. Guidelines are at https://poetrylondon.co.uk/submissions/. In addition, they have the **Poetry London Prize** competition. First prize is £5,000; second prize is £2,000; third prize is £1,000, plus publication in *Poetry London*. Entry fee is £8 per poem; deadline is 30 June 2022. Details are at https://poetrylondon.co.uk/competition/.

The **Jewish Literary Journal** publishes online on the first of every month. *The Jewish Literary Journal aims to publish the best creative writing dealing with Jewish themes and Jewish identity.* They are always open for submissions, and there is no fee to submit. They do not accept simultaneous submissions, but they do promise a response within one month. They do accept previously published material. Guidelines are at https://jewishliteraryjournal.com/submission-guidelines/.

Minyan bills itself as "a literary magazine in support of the Jewish community." It publishes online four time per year. *Our mission is to publish the finest poetry and flash fiction by Jewish writers and their allies*. Befitting its name, each issue of *Minyan* contains the work of ten writers. Submission is free and is open year-round. Guidelines are at www.minyanmag.com/submissions.html.

The Ilanot Review is a biannual international online journal based in Israel. It is edited by alumni and faculty from the Shaindy Rudoff Graduate Program in Creative Writing at Bar-Ilan University, with guest editors. The theme for the Fall 2022 edition is Want. Deadline for submissions is July 31. Submissions are free until June 14 or until Submittable's submission caps are reached, whichever comes first; after that, they charge a submission fee of \$3. Guidelines are at http://www.ilanotreview.com/submissions-page/.

Arc Poetry Magazine is a print journal based in Ottawa, Canada, that publishes three issues per year. We feature poetry that is woozy, cunning, shearing and wildlike. There is no fee to submit, and they pay \$50 per page of poetry plus a free copy of the magazine. The submission deadline is July 31, 2022. Guidelines are at https://arcpoetry.ca/submit/.

Frontier Poetry is an online poetry site. We are looking for poetry that pushes language forward, for poets and poems that strive to place themselves at the edge of what language can do. They have two open calls for submission. In the **New Voices** category, submissions are open to new and emerging poets only, meaning poets with no more than one full-length published work. Submissions are open year-round. Submissions are free, with an option to pay for editorial feedback. They pay \$50 per poem, up to \$150. The **Frontier Open Contest** is open to established and emerging poets alike. The winner will receive a prize of \$5,000, and ten finalists will each receive \$100. The submission fee is \$20 for up to three poems. The deadline is July 17, 2022. Guidelines for both New Voices and Frontier Open are at www.frontierpoetry.com/submit/.

Muddy River Poetry Review is a biannual online journal published by Zvi A. Sesling, first-place winner of the 2007 Reuben Rose Competition. There is no fee to submit. Submission deadline is September 1, 2022. Guidelines are at https://muddyriverpoetryreview.webs.com/guidelines.htm.
