LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

May was a quiet month from the viewpoint of Voices Israel activities, but a fair bit of planning for the future has been going on behind the scenes.

First, a reminder: following the Bar Sagi and Reuben Rose awards events, Zoom recordings of them, and of the Open Mic, are up on our YouTube channel. All three videos, and earlier Voices Israel YouTube content, can be viewed at https://www.youtube.com/@voicesisrael.

Stop-press news: the American poet Nancy Shiffrin has just agreed to be our Overseas Judge for this year's Reuben Rose competition. Thank you to Ricky Friesem for recommending her!

And we've decided it's time to **update the prizes and entry fees for the Reuben Rose Competition.** They haven't been raised for a least a decade (we simply don't have records from earlier) and have become seriously undervalued. So we're raising the First, Second and Third Prizes to \$750, \$250, and \$100 respectively. That's just over a 50% increase altogether. The entry fees are going up by less: a quarter to a third: to \$8, \$16 and \$24 (instead of \$6, \$12 and \$18) for one, three and six poems respectively. For comparison: most competitions these days seem to charge \$15 to \$20 for "up to three poems" with no reduction for larger numbers.

On June 19th we have a **Zoom mini-workshop**, "Crossroads," a consideration of the choices we make in life, as seen through the lens of Bible stories and a poem by Keats, led by Dina Yehuda. If you haven't registered and want a place, please see the notice in this newsletter.

Dina's also been working hard on the Anthology, which is now in the final stages of preparation for printing. Those of you who have poems in it received the PDF for proofreading a couple of weeks ago. Anyone who didn't, please contact me urgently! Anyone who got the file but didn't yet proofread their poem, please do so NOW because we'll be sending it to the printers soon.

We were a little disappointed to see that several of our regular contributors didn't send in poems – apparently they forgot and missed the deadline. Please everyone do mark submission deadlines in your calendar – I'm sure we missed some lovely poems this year, purely out of forgetfulness!

As you may remember, we were looking for a place to hold workshops in the central area, i.e. Tel Aviv, but were having trouble finding a suitable location at a reasonable price. I'm happy to report that it looks like we'll be able to hold them at the Tel Aviv central Public Library, Bet Ariella. It's easily accessible from the Savidor train station and the room there has everything we need, at a very reasonable cost. We're planning one there in the Fall, after the High Holidays. Stay tuned!

As before, I have to remind you that, sadly, we still have no Publicity Officer. We've reduced the duties of this position to just sending out, by email, notices of upcoming national events. It isn't a lot of work. Please, if you can help, contact Wendy at Blumfieldwendy@gmail.com.



Snakeskin is a monthly poetry webzine based in the UK. They occasionally have a themed issue, but most months they are open to poems of any length, any style, and any subject matter. There is no fee to submit and, except for the occasional themed issue, there are no deadlines. They try to give you a decision within a month of submission. The 2023 Frontier Open Poetry Contest is now open to submissions. First prize is \$5,000 (yes, that's five thousand dollars) plus publication; nine runners-up will receive \$100 plus publication. Send up to three poems per submission, for a total of no more than twelve pages. We have no aesthetic or formal requirements and consider all styles of poetry. The submission fee is \$20 and the submission deadline is July 16. Winners and finalists will be announced in the fall of 2023. More information at www.frontierpoetry.com/poetry-awards/.

The Ilanot Review is an international English-language biannual online literary journal affiliated with the Shaindy Rudoff Graduate Program in Creative Writing at Bar-Ilan University, Israel. Submissions for the fall 2023 issue on the theme of "Parents" are open from June 1 to July 31. Submit up to five poems, not to exceed seven pages. Submissions are free until June 14 or until Submittable's submission caps are reached, whichever comes first. After that, they charge a submission fee of \$3.
