LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear All,

Our Secretary Linda has been working hard for a couple of months to give our newsletter a new look. In this issue it finally "goes live." We hope you like the result as much as we do!

This month saw the transfer of two important national roles – that of President and Membership Coordinator. In the process of the handover, there was a mix-up of some records, so that some of our members received reminders to pay membership dues even though they had already paid. To those of you who received such letters – our regrets and apologies. To those who really haven't yet paid the dues – please do find the opportunity to do so!

We hope this month to put on our website an option to make payments, such as membership dues, via PayPal. This will solve the problem of how to pay for people who are self-isolating, and especially our members abroad.

We have continued to refine our use of Zoom for group meetings and have discovered that although only the official Voices host (our Past President, Susan Olsburgh) can schedule meetings, she can designate the group coordinator, or another group member, as an "alternate host." This means that the group coordinator can take full control of the meeting. As usual, please contact Susan if you'd like to take advantage of this arrangement.

We welcomed back our Ashkelon group, which Chaim Bezalel has re-started with a meeting on June 9th. Happy Muse-ing, Ashkelon! Ashkelon was thus the guinea-pig for our new Zoom scheduling arrangement.

The Anthology, after intensive proof-reading, is finally at the printer's. We look forward to being able to distribute it in the Fall. Our warm thanks to Johnmichael Simon, who has once again produced a beautiful volume, but, to our regret, is now retiring as Anthology producer. Johnmichael, we can never thank you enough for all you have done for Voices for so many years! We look forward

to continuing to meet you, virtually or in person, at Voices events.

The Reuben Rose competition is once again set to start in mid-July. Watch our website — the Submit button will appear there when submissions start.

Finally, we have become aware that putting the Newsletter on the website jeopardizes the "unpublished" status of the poems in it: most literary outlets define "publication" to include anything put on the Internet, even if it is in the back pages of a society newsletter. Each outlet makes its own policy, but if a magazine finds a submitted poem on our website and queries it, neither the poet nor Voices as an organization have any valid argument to fall back on, regarding why it should not be considered "published." Therefore, in order not to restrict our members' publication options, the version of the Newsletter uploaded to our website will, as of this month, no longer include the poems. The full Newsletter including the poems will of course continue to be circulated to our members by email – such distribution to specific people definitely does not constitute publication.

Corona is once again raising its ugly head so that our return to normal for the events currently "on hold" looks uncertain. Meanwhile: take care and stay safe! With best wishes,
