There is a lot going on in the next couple of months! The anthology has been printed and you should all get it in time for the Zoomed Launch event on September 22nd. We have had a wonderful response for the Anthology launch - 35 poets have registered to read poems, which means that we'll be limited to one poem each. If there's time left after that, we can have a second round, but it looks unlikely. Everyone who has registered to read at the launch event - please email me which poem you would like to read in Round 1 (remembering that there will probably not be time to read the second one).

We're now closing the list of readers. Those who haven't registered are welcome to attend without reading a poem - sorry!

North American event - Diane Ray in Seattle is organizing a Voices Israel poetry-reading event for our US and Canadian members, to take place (of course via Zoom) on Sunday September 13th at 11 am Seattle time: see the invitation included in this newsletter. We'll be holding the joint Reuben Rose and Bar Sagi prize-giving events after Sukkot, on October 27th at 7:30 pm Israel time - again, by Zoom. Our sponsor for the Bar Sagi prize, Bar's grandfather Prof. Anthony Joseph and his wife, will take part, and we really hope that as many of our members as possible will attend to honour our Reuben Rose prize-winners and especially to encourage our young poets, the winners of the Bar Sagi prize.

We are opening the next Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize to a number of Jewish schools overseas, for a trial year. The prize will remain general - all subjects accepted, not limited to "the Jewish experience". Many thanks to our sponsor, Prof. Anthony Joseph, and to our team leaders: Ricky Friesem, consultant, and Wendy Dickstein, administrator and one of the judges, for all their help in making this possible.

North American members take note - Diane would also like to start a North American "local" group after the High Holidays, via Zoom. It will hold monthly meetings where you can bring your poems for friendly critique and get to know each other, the way our Israeli members do. We have enough North American members to run two such groups, so optimally this could be a Western group, with a parallel Central-and-Eastern group. If any of you living in the Central or Eastern time zones of the US or Canada would like to coordinate such a group, please contact me (president@voicesisrael.com).
