Voices Israel's success depends on the willingness of us all to volunteer and "give back" a little.** 

During June-July we received poems for the Haifa workshop chapbook from almost all its participants and have now produced both chapbooks and mailed them to everyone who ordered one by mail. Together with the chapbook you should also have all received the 2021 *Voices Israel Anthology*. It's a beautiful volume, very professionally designed and produced. Many, many thanks to Avril Meallem who worked long and hard to make it so.

The next activity coming up is the Anthology launch event. Faced with the vagaries of Covid revivals, and the fact that September is largely taken up by the High Holidays, we've set the date for October 3rd. Right now, we're planning on holding it face to face, as before at the Karaoke Bar in Netanya, which is a convenient central location easily accessible by train and with ample parking for cars. And, of course, if we can't meet face to face, we'll hold it via Zoom. #### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### The 31st Reuben Rose Memorial Poetry Competition

First prize \$500, second prize \$150, third prize \$50, ten honorable mentions. **Deadline is November 15, 2021**. Among the thirteen winners, no poet is included twice in the same year.

All prizewinners and honorable mentions will be published in the coming year's Voices Israel poetry anthology.

The competition is sponsored by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English (<a href="http://voicesisrael.com/">http://voicesisrael.com/</a>) but it is open to all. (You do not need to be a member of the Group.)

Submit original poetry, in English, on any topic. Challenging, humorous, and/or eccentric poetry is welcome, but typographical tricks are discouraged, and any illustrations will be discarded. Entry fee: \$18 for 6 poems, \$12 for 3 poems, or \$6 for 1 poem.

Line limit per poem: 41 lines, including any stanza breaks, dedication, epigraph, etc. but not including the title. Microsoft Word is the preferred format, but you may submit in PDF if you have an unusual structure to reproduce.

Poems must be unpublished and must remain unpublished until the list of winners is e-mailed to the entrants (target date is early February). Thereafter you may publish and republish as you like; copyright remains with you, and we claim only a non-exclusive license to publish and republish the winning poems and honorable mentions in any form, physical or digital. For our purposes, poems are not considered previously published if they have appeared in the Voices Israel newsletter or in a Voices Israel workshop chapbook.

Submit at <a href="https://voicesisrael.submittable.com/submit">https://voicesisrael.submittable.com/submit</a>. Poems are judged without the poets' names. The judges' decision is not subject to appeal. Make sure that your name appears only on the Submittable page, not anywhere in the file you send or in the file's name.

The judges for the 2021 competition are:

Ricky Rapoport Friesem - last year's First Prize winner.

Jane Seitel - last year's Second Prize winner.

David Caplan - this year's Overseas Judge.

David Caplan is a Full Professor of English and assistant director of creative writing at Ohio Wesleyan University. He is a member of the executive Committee of the Modern Language Association's Creative Writing Forum. He has published two books of poems, has won the Virginia quarterly Reviews Emily Clark Balch Prize for Poetry, and is a contributing editor to the Virginia Quarterly Review and to Pleiades: A Journal of New Writing. In 2018, when on sabbatical in Israel, he gave us a workshop in Haifa, and we are very happy to welcome him back to Voices Israel as our Overseas Judge.

#### **ORISON ANTHOLOGY EDITORIAL NOMINATIONS** Orison Books

Editors of literary periodicals (print or digital) may nominate work in a single genre or in multiple genres to be considered for inclusion in our annual Orison Anthology, which reprints the finest spiritually engaged writing from a broad and inclusive range of perspectives. Work selected for inclusion will appear alongside the winners of The Orison Anthology Awards in Fiction, Nonfiction, and Poetry, judged each year by different prominent writers. The author of any work selected for inclusion will receive a complimentary copy of the anthology; the periodical where the work originally appeared will also receive a complimentary copy.

The work may be by a single author or by multiple authors, as long as the total page count meets the requirements specified below.

By nominating work for inclusion in The Orison Anthology, you are indicating that you have acquired the permission of the author(s) to do so.

Editors may submit a scanned copy of print pages or a PDF file of the text.

Submission period: August 1 - October 1 each year

Single genre submissions: Submit up to 6 poems (40 pp. max), or up to 2 works of prose (any genre; 60 pp. max). If the work is not easily classified, submit up to 60 pages of text. In the file, include the author's name and biography, the name of your periodical, and the issue number(s) in which the work appeared.

Multiple genre submissions: submit up to 3 poems (20 pp. max) and a work of prose (any genre; 25 pp. max). If the work is not easily classified, submit up to 60 pages of text. In the file, include the author's name and biography, the name of your periodical, and the issue number(s) in which the work appeared.

There is no fee to nominate work for The Orison Anthology.

**Tom Howard/Margaret Reid Poetry Contest** has announced a September 30 deadline for submission to their 19<sup>th</sup> annual contest. We will award the Tom Howard Prize of \$3,000 for a poem in any style or genre, and the Margaret Reid Prize of \$3,000 for a poem that rhymes or has a traditional style.

The entry fee is \$15 for each submission of 1-2 poems. Ten Honorable Mentions will receive \$200 each (any style). The top 12 entries will be published online. The top two winners will also receive two-year gift certificates from our cosponsor, **Duotrope**. Submit published or unpublished work online via **Submittable**. Most countries eligible. Length limit per poem: 250 lines. This contest is recommended by **Reedsy**.

**Nimrod International Journal** is calling for submissions to its Spring/Summer 2022 thematic issue, *What Now?: The Future We Make*. We would love to see your poems, short stories, creative nonfiction pieces, or translations that explore microand macro-versions of the future: both our futures on an individual, relationship, or family level and our social, national, and worldwide future.

## Poetry on Planes – Status Report 6 / August 6, 2021

Fellow poets,

The dictionary speculates that the phrase "No news is good news" may have been coined by King James I of England in the year 1616, which, apart from William Shakespeare's death on April 23rd, doesn't seem to have been a particularly bad year.

And in the poetry world, it was the year Ben Jonson's First Folio was published, followed in 1617 by him being named England's first Poet Laureate.

Fast-forward to news of the Poetry on Planes project.

First, to those of you who have written requesting an update – thank you for your ongoing interest and support.

Second, well, we're still working on it.

Between waves of pandemic and the out-of-the-mainstream idea of a poetry anthology designed to be sold in airport bookstores, publishers have thus far proved... reluctant.

We will, however, persevere. There are agents and publishers yet to pitch, and publishers, including those of both aviation books and airline in-flight magazines yet to be contacted.

In the words of Carthaginian General Hannibal (he of elephants through the Alps fame) "We will either find a way or make one."

That said, we still can't tell you if your poem is in or out... because we don't know. Publishers will have their way. But we can tell -- and show -- you a few things (see attached PDF).

We have a draft manuscript that we feel is world-class. It currently comes in at 143 pages, including the cover, dedication page and introduction – see below – as well as table of contents, biographies, some blank pages where we encourage the reader to write a poem, and four pages of marketing plan (we'd be happy to hear from anyone with additional ideas, reality check, etc.)

The contents of Poetry on Planes is divided into categories, each with its own title page and an epigram from our contributors: At the Airport, Take-Off, Poems on Planes, Pilots & Air Crew, Deep Thoughts at Angels Forty, A Muse Amused, In-Flight Anxiety, Emergency, Landing, Post-Flight, Jet Lag, History and A Few Last Words From Almost There.
