#### LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

It's the summer holiday lull! – but our most important event of the summer is in full swing: **the Reuben Rose**Competition is open for submissions and will remain open till October 15<sup>th</sup>. Do enter your best poems for the chance to win one of the prizes or an Honorable Mention!

The 2022 Anthology was distributed two or three weeks ago and I hope that all paid-up members in Israel have by now received their copy. If you haven't, please email me and let me know. (Of course if the reason is that you forgot to renew membership – you know what to do! See the Join Us or Renew Membership page of our website (https://www.voicesisrael.com/join-us-or-renew-membership) for details).

Many thanks to everyone who worked so hard on the Anthology – especially our Editor, Dina, the three other hard-working members of the editing team, and Chanita who has the onerous job of distributing it. Reminder: a couple of years ago our Anthology started to be indexed in the EBSCO humanities database which most university libraries plus the Tel Aviv public libraries subscribe to, together with thousands of libraries abroad; giving us a good chance of a much wider exposure to the poetry-interested public.

Looking forward, we have a busy schedule ahead! The Anthology launch event is slated to be held at the Karaoke Bar in Netanya after Succot, starting at 6 pm on October 25th. A notice about it is in this newsletter. We're asking, like last year, whether you'd prefer an in-person or Zoom event; please do all reply and let us know in time, whether you have a preference. If not enough people want to come to an in-person event, we need to know that in time to cancel it and organize a Zoom one instead, which means at least a couple of weeks before the date.

Then in mid-November we're planning to hold a workshop in Haifa, given by two of our Haifa members. We'll put out full details as soon as we have them. Around the same time, the fourth Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize will open for submissions. We need your help to publicize it to teachers. if you know any English teachers – your children's or grandchildren's; former or current colleagues; friends – please do suggest it to them. Finally, we'll round off the year with the opening in mid-December of the submission period for the 2023 Anthology.

#### THE REUBEN ROSE COMPETITION IS NOW OPEN!

Voices Israel holds an annual competition in memory of Reuben Rose, one of the founders of the Voices Israel Group of Poets. Submissions are invited from English-language poets throughout the world and are judged by a panel of three independent judges.

First prize in the competition is US\$500, second prize is US\$150, and third prize is US\$50. Ten honorable mentions are awarded as well. All prize winners and honorable mentions will be published in print in the Voices Israel Anthology, and online on the Voices Israel website.

The 2022 competition is now open for submissions and will remain open until October 15, 2022.

The judges for the 2022 competition are:

- Yiskah Rosenfeld First Prize winner, 2021
- Reuven Goldfarb Honorable Mention, 2021
- Yehoshua November Acclaimed American poet, Overseas Judge for 2022.

#### **Submission Procedure**

Anyone, anywhere may submit to the competition. Poems may be on any topic but must be in English and must be previously unpublished, in print or online, and must remain unpublished until the list of winners is e-mailed to the entrants. (Inclusion in the monthly Voices Israel newsletter or in a chapbook from a Voices Israel workshop is not considered publication.)

Line limit per poem is 41 lines, including any stanza breaks, dedication, epigraph, etc., but not including the title. Lines that are too long to fit on one page-line will be counted as two lines. Challenging, humorous, and/or eccentric poetry is welcome, but typographical tricks are discouraged and any illustrations will be discarded.

Poems are judged anonymously - without the poets' names. Please make sure that your name appears only on the Submission page, **not** anywhere in the file you send or in the file's name.

No poet may win more than one prize or Honorable Mention in the same year's competition — i.e. among the thirteen winners, no poet will be included more than once.

Voices Israel claims a non-exclusive license to publish and republish the winning poems and honorable mentions in all media, while the poet retains copyright and is free to publish and republish after the winners are announced.

Entry fees are: U\$\$6.00 for 1 poem U\$\$12.00 for 3 poems U\$\$18.00 for 6 poems.

The 2022 Voices Israel Anthology was sent out to all members in mid-August; hopefully you've all received it. Now let's celebrate it the way we want – with a Launch Event in a central location! Come and read your poem(s) from the Anthology, or just relax and enjoy with other members. You are welcome to bring guests.

When: Tuesday October 25th, 6 pm to 9 pm – right after the High Holidays.

**Where**: Stage Karaoke Bar: 9 Arieh Regev Street, Netanya. A convenient central location, with good parking and an easy two-minute walk from the Netanya-Sapir train station.

Cost including a light supper: 60 NIS per person. (There's a meat or vegetarian option, as usual).

**It could be Zoomed:** Depending on the number of registrations, the feedback from our members, and the state of the Corona situation in October, the Launch could be moved to Zoom. In that case the event costs nothing, and our overseas members can join us, but we'll each have to bring our own food.

- If you wish to act as a proxy reader for someone else's poem. (If there are particular poems you would like to read, please include that information.)
- Light supper option for you and each of your guests. (Meat option is hamburger or chicken wrap; vegetarian option is a stir-fried veggie wrap.)
- Any additional information or comments that you wish to include.

**Please note:** If we decide to hold the Launch on Zoom, we will need to cancel the room booking in advance **or we will have to pay for it**. Therefore, it is important to register no later than Sunday, October 9th, which is Erev Sukkot.

The editors, Simon Lichman and Michael Kagan, will consider original, unpublished poetry and short stories (flash fiction) in English. No translations or essays will be accepted for this issue.

You do not have to be a member of IAWE to submit your work. A number of pages will be reserved for contributions from outside Israel.

Submission guidelines:

- Submit 1-3 poems, not exceeding 50 lines per poem, or prose of no more than 1,000 words, together with your name, a short bio, and contact details, all in a single file in Word format where the Word document title is your name, and email to: arc30submissions@gmail.com
- Do not submit more than one file.
- Please use 12-point Times New Roman, single-spaced for poems and double-spaced for prose.

Contributors retain copyright and may also republish. We ask only that you acknowledge that the poem or short story first appeared in *arc*. The IAWE also retains the right to republish material from *arc* 30 in any form.

The editors are under no obligation to accept any particular submission, and their decision is final. At this time the IAWE cannot pay authors for work published, but each contributor will receive a free copy of *arc 30*.

#### CALLS FOR SUBMISSIONS

**Confingo Magazine** is based in Manchester, UK. *Twice a year we publish a collection of new short fiction, poetry and art from around the world in a beautifully produced, print-only magazine.* Maximum length for poems is 50 lines. There is no fee to submit. Writers whose work is accepted for publication receive a payment of £20. Full guidelines are at www.confingopublishing.uk/submissions.

**Jerry Jazz Musician** is an online site of poetry and prose that *will appeal to readers who have an interest in jazz music and related culture*. No deadline; no submission fee. Submission guidelines are at https://jerryjazzmusician.com/submit-your-work/.

**Mediterranean Poetry** is an online journal of poems inspired in one way or another by the Mediterranean world, including Israel. Previously published poetry is accepted. There is no deadline and no submission fee. Some Israel-themed poetry can be found at www.odyssey.pm/contributors/jake-marmer/. Submission guidelines are at www.odyssey.pm/submission-guidelines/.

The Fiddlehead is a quarterly print journal published at the University of New Brunswick in Canada. The Fiddlehead publishes excellent writing in English, or translations into English, from all over the world and in a variety of styles, including experimental genres. They will be open for submissions from September 15 through November 30. They pay contributors \$60 CAD per published page plus two complimentary copies of the journal and the option to purchase additional copies at a discount. Palette Poetry presents The 2022 Love & Eros Prize. We encourage love poems beyond the confines of what's traditionally "romantic." Rather, we're seeking unflinching examinations of our sharpest human sensations—those of desire, longing, devotion, and intimacy. First prize is \$3,000; second prize is \$300; third prize is \$200. The judge is award-winning poet Carl Phillips. Entrance fee is \$20 to submit a packet of three poems. The deadline is October 16. **Bloom** is an online literary site for authors whose first major work was published when they were age 40 or older. In other words, for those *who bloomed in their own good time*. There is no deadline, no submission fee, and no payment to contributors. Submission guidelines are at <a href="https://bloomsite.wordpress.com/submit/">https://bloomsite.wordpress.com/submit/</a>.

**BoomerLitMag** is a quarterly online journal of poetry and prose. *Because our writing reflects not just our time of life but the historical and cultural time in which we came of age, our most natural audience is other Boomers. We are happily open to all writers and readers, and have featured authors from age 17 to age 97 on a myriad of topics, but have a home base in the Boomer generation.* There is no deadline, no submission fee, no payment. **Consequence Forum** publishes poems and stories that *address in some manner the human consequences and realities of war or geopolitical violence*. All submissions will be considered for either their print publication (*Consequence* journal) or their website (*Consequence* online). There is no fee to submit. They pay \$40 per poem.
