LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear All,

Being once again in lockdown – now more stringent than ever – does not prevent us from carrying on activities, as far as possible "as normal." On September 22nd, we had very successful Zoomed Anthology launch event, attended by a record 51 members of whom 37 read their poems. Many thanks to all the participants, especially our North American members who made a special effort to attend – it was wonderful to be able to share this event with you.

On September 13th we held a lovely poetry-reading event for our North American members, ably organized by Diane Ray of Seattle, WA (thank you again, Diane!). Nine US and Canadian members read their poems, with a focus on poems that have been published in the Voices Anthology. I as President and Dina Yehuda as Chief Editor of the Anthology were also invited to attend and read poems, and there were a few guests from both the U.S. and Israel. Zoom worked perfectly and another member, Ellen Jaffe, has already expressed hopes to organize a similar event from Canada, perhaps after Chanukah (thank you, Ellen!). We hope to produce an e-chapbook of this event, so everyone who read at it is invited to send the poems they read to me at this address (president@voicesisrael.com). The chapbook will be distributed only to those who took part in the event, so that it will not count as "publication" and prevent members from submitting those poems elsewhere (or as contravention of copyright if they were previously published).

North American members take note — Diane is unable, due to other commitments, to coordinate the North American "local" Zoom group we've been planning. The group would hold monthly meetings (via the Voices Zoom subscription) where you can bring your poems for friendly critique and get to know each other, the way our Israeli members do. Optimally, for time-zone reasons, we'd like a separate Western and Central-and-Eastern group. If any US or Canadian member is able to coordinate either group (or one North American one), please contact me (address as above). This would be an exciting development, and we hope these groups will continue to thrive as virtual meeting-places long after Corona has been vanquished.

Meanwhile, the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize and Reuben Rose Competition's joint awards event is upcoming on October 27th. All the Bar Sagi winners have confirmed that they will be attending and I'm really hoping for a large registration to show our support for them, and our appreciation of the Reuben Rose winners and Honorable Mentions. Registration for this Zoom event has now started - please all who wish to attend, including the winners of prizes or Honorable Mentions, register with Linda (secretary.voices@gmail.com) to ensure that you get the Zoom invitation. We need a few proxy readers for this event - please tell Linda when registering, if you would like to proxy read. And we hope to have time for an open mike at the end of the event - if you would like to read a poem at the open mike session, please say so when you register.

The next Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize opens for submissions on November 15th. The announcement is included in this newsletter. Do you have a teenage child or grandchild who writes poetry in English (or in Hebrew but would like to try their hand at poetry in English)? Do let them know about this prize and tell their English teacher too!

The Voices Israel Group of Poets in English announces the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize Competition, 2021

The Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize competition commemorates a talented young Israeli poet, Bar Sagi, who died at the age of fifteen. The competition was established by Bar's family and is administered by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English.

The 2021 competition is open to Israeli school students, and this year we are also opening it to students from Jewish schools outside Israel.

Submission dates: November 15, 2020 through January 15, 2021.

Cash prizes will be awarded to three winning poems: 600 NIS first prize, 400 NIS second prize, 200 NIS third prize – or the equivalent in the winner's local currency. One or more other poems may be awarded an Honorable Mention.

There is no fee for entering the competition.

Competition rules and submission guidelines

- The competition is open to young poets aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written.
- There is no submission fee.
- Poets may use their whole name, first name, or a pseudonym. We will not publish any contact information.
- Poets submit by sending up to three poems, by email, in one file either in the body of the email, or as an attached Word file to bar.sagiprize@gmail.com.
- The parent or guardian's name and mailing address, and the child's age when the poems were written, must be included somewhere within the document.
- Poems may be in any style and on any subject, but each must have no more than 41 lines (not including title), and they must be in English.
- Poems must be previously unpublished. The poets retain sole copyright of their poems.
- Prizes will be presented by Bar Sagi's family, and the winning poets will read their poems, at a prize-giving ceremony held by Voices Israel, usually together with the prize-giving for the Reuben Rose competition, Voices Israel's annual poetry competition for adults.
- The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if there are any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology. Upon acceptance, a parent or legal guardian must sign a release allowing us to publish the poem.
