## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

I hope you all enjoyed the High Holidays – and now the Anthology launch is nearly upon us. As you know, we have given up on the feasibility of holding a face-to-face meeting and have moved the launch event to Zoom. I look forward to seeing you all on October 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7 pm Israel time (12 noon US East Coast time, 9 am Pacific time, 5 pm UK time). If anyone hasn't yet registered and would like to, please email me *immediately* to president@voicesisrael.com.

We've extended the closing date for the 2021 Reuben Rose competition until November 15th. Please do send in your best poems now, to avoid a last-minute rush and backlog! This means that the judges' decisions will also be announced a month or so later than usual – in mid-January 2022 rather than mid-December.

As a result, we've also moved the dates for submitting to the Anthology by one month – the submission period will now start on January 15<sup>th</sup> and run until April 15<sup>th</sup>. This allows you all to get the results of the Reuben Rose competition, and if your poem did not win a prize or Honourable Mention, you then have plenty of time to enter it for the Anthology!

The submission period for the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize remains as it was – starting November 15<sup>th</sup>. Please everybody do remind all your family, friends and others who may be interested, and direct them to the information on the Bar Sagi Prize page of our website: <a href="https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize">https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize</a>. This year we are reverting to the original format of the competition – it is open to Israeli students only. The trial we held last year showed that it is indeed not fair to expect Israeli school students to compete against those from an English-speaking society where English poetry is extensively taught in schools.

We're delighted to announce that Pesach Rotem has agreed to take over as Voices secretary from Linda when she retires next March. Welcome Pesach and many thanks! I am looking forward to working with him. Pesach will start working with Linda in January to ensure a smooth transition; Linda will retire at the 2022 AGM and head for a well-earned rest!

**Looking ahead:** we are planning a workshop in Jerusalem to be given by Dr. Judy Belsky in late November, either face-to-face or via Zoom according to the Corona situation.

I'm happy to note that, after reverting to Zoom due to the latest Corona spike, our Netanya group is now back to face-to-face meetings, so we have two groups, Haifa and Netanya, who are resolutely pursuing "business as usual." **Reminder**: any of our members may join any group meeting via Zoom, subject to agreement with the group's coordinator.

I wish us all a healthy, happy and productive year ahead!

## The 31st Reuben Rose Memorial Poetry Competition

First prize \$500, second prize \$150, third prize \$50, ten honorable mentions. **Deadline is November 15, 2021**. Among the thirteen winners, no poet is included twice in the same year.

All prizewinners and honorable mentions will be published in the coming year's Voices Israel poetry anthology.

The competition is sponsored by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English (<a href="http://voicesisrael.com/">http://voicesisrael.com/</a>) but it is open to all. (You do not need to be a member of the Group.)

Submit original poetry, in English, on any topic. Challenging, humorous, and/or eccentric poetry is welcome, but typographical tricks are discouraged, and any illustrations will be discarded. Entry fee: \$18 for 6 poems, \$12 for 3 poems, or \$6 for 1 poem.

Line limit per poem: 41 lines, including any stanza breaks, dedication, epigraph, etc. but not including the title. Microsoft Word is the preferred format, but you may submit in PDF if you have an unusual structure to reproduce.

Poems must be unpublished and must remain unpublished until the list of winners is e-mailed to the entrants (target date is early February). Thereafter you may publish and republish as you like; copyright remains with you, and we claim only a non-exclusive license to publish and republish the winning poems and honorable mentions in any form, physical or digital. For our purposes, poems are not considered previously published if they have appeared in the Voices Israel newsletter or in a Voices Israel workshop chapbook.

Submit at <a href="https://voicesisrael.submittable.com/submit">https://voicesisrael.submittable.com/submit</a>. Poems are judged without the poets' names. The judges' decision is not subject to appeal. Make sure that your name appears only on the Submittable page, not anywhere in the file you send or in the file's name.

Ricky Rapoport Friesem - last year's First Prize winner.

Jane Seitel - last year's Second Prize winner.

David Caplan - this year's Overseas Judge.

David Caplan is a Full Professor of English and assistant director of creative writing at Ohio Wesleyan University. He is a member of the executive Committee of the Modern Language Association's Creative Writing Forum. He has published two books of poems, has won the Virginia quarterly Reviews Emily Clark Balch Prize for Poetry, and is a contributing editor to the Virginia Quarterly Review and to Pleiades: A Journal of New Writing. In 2018, when on sabbatical in Israel, he gave us a workshop in Haifa, and we are very happy to welcome him back to Voices Israel as our Overseas Judge.

## The Voices Israel Group of Poets in English announces the Third Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize Competition, 2022

The Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize commemorates a talented young Israeli poet, Bar Sagi, who died at the age of fifteen. The competition was established by Bar's family and is administered by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English in consultation with Prof. Anthony Joseph, Bar's grandfather.

The competition is open to Israeli school students aged 12 through 19.

**Submission dates:** November 15, 2021, through January 15, 2022.

**Cash prizes will be awarded** to three winning poems: 400 NIS first prize, 250 NIS second prize, 100 NIS third prize. One or more other poems may be awarded an Honorable Mention.

There is no fee for entering the competition.

## Competition rules and submission guidelines

- The competition is open to young poets aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written.
- Poets may use their whole name, first name, or a pseudonym. We will not publish any contact information.
- Poets submit by sending up to three poems, by email, in one file either in the body of the email, or as an attached Word file to <a href="mailto:barsagivoices@gmail.com">barsagivoices@gmail.com</a>.
- The parent or guardian's name and postal address, and the child's age when the poems were written, must be included somewhere within the document.
- Poems may be in any style and on any subject, but each must have no more than 41 lines (not including title), and they must be in English.
- Poems must be previously unpublished. The poets retain sole copyright of their poems.
- Prizes will be presented by Bar Sagi's family, and the winning poets will read their poems, at a prize-giving ceremony held by Voices Israel. This may be held separately, or together with the prize-giving for the Reuben Rose competition, Voices Israel's annual poetry competition for adults.
- The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if there are any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology. Upon acceptance, a parent or legal guardian must sign a release allowing us to publish the poem.


