# VOICES ISRAEL GROUP OF POETS IN ENGLISH LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear All,

As winter arrives with the first real rainfalls of the year, I feel we are all hunkering down in our houses waiting for the COVID vaccines to finally let us back into normal life! Luckily, we meanwhile have Zoom to enable us all to keep each other company.

The submissions period for the second Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize opened on November 15<sup>th</sup>. This year it has been widened to include entries from students in Jewish schools abroad (mainly in the UK), and has also been well publicized by our indefatigable Publicity Officer, Wendy Blumfield, so we are hoping for a good number of submissions this year.

In mid-month too we held the first meeting of our new Zoom group for people without a convenient local one; most participants were Israeli but several were from the UK and USA; our sole African member, Bob Mwangi of Kenya, registered but a slow Internet connection let him down. Better luck next time, Bob! Since we still didn't have a good name for this group, I invited suggestions; the winner is Global Zoom Group – Global Group for short (Multinational Zoom Group was a close second but we went with the shorter, alliterative name). Thank you to those members who sent in suggestions! Anyone who wishes to join is invited to email me – note that if the group grows too big, preference will be given to people who don't have a local group that they can attend (whether in Israel, or overseas members).

We were approached by EBSCO, a supplier of databases to thousands of academic and public libraries worldwide, to include our Anthology in their poetry database, and I'm happy to say that the Board voted unanimously in favour. The Anthology will not be available for free download; rather, individual poems will be viewable, together with the bibliographic citation of the Anthology and a link to our website where those interested can purchase the anthology from us. This is a great opportunity to publicize more widely Voices Israel, our poets and their work; it counts as publicity not re-publication. The agreement is ongoing – we will upload future years as soon as each volume has been published.

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, we are restarting our workshops in shortened (two-hour) Zoom format, with what I hope will be a series, one workshop every couple of months, at least until we can un-Zoom sometime next year. As you've all seen from the notice Linda sent out, I'll be giving the first such workshop, on metrical poetry, on December 29<sup>th</sup>. I was happily surprised to see the amount of interest in this somewhat technical subject – within two days of the announcement, we had 20 registrants! We have now reached the limit of 25, but since these are Zoom workshops, it's very easy to re-run them, so please continue to register for the waiting list, and if we have enough interest – for this or any future Zoom workshop – we can easily offer it again. We have another workshop planned for the end of February, after that we'll either try to organize one for end April – May, or, possibly, be able to hold our much-delayed two-day Poetry By The Sea workshop in Netanya, in May or early June (I can dream can't I?).

#### The Voices Israel Group of Poets in English announces the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize Competition, 2021

The Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize competition commemorates a talented young Israeli poet, Bar Sagi, who died at the age of fifteen. The competition was established by Bar's family and is administered by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English.

The 2021 competition is open to Israeli school students, and this year we are also opening it to students from Jewish schools outside Israel.

#### Submission dates: November 15, 2020 through January 15, 2021.

**Cash prizes will be awarded** to three winning poems: 600 NIS first prize, 400 NIS second prize, 200 NIS third prize – or the equivalent in the winner's local currency. One or more other poems may be awarded an honorable mention.

There is no fee for entering the competition.

#### Competition rules and submission guidelines

- The competition is open to young poets aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written.
- There is no submission fee.
- Poets may use their whole name, first name, or a pseudonym. We will not publish any contact information.
- Poets submit by sending up to three poems, by email, in one file either in the body of the email, or as an attached Word file – to <u>barsagivoices@gmail.com</u>
- The parent or guardian's name and mailing address, and the child's age when the poems were written, must be included somewhere within the document.
- Poems may be in any style and on any subject, but each must have no more than 41 lines (not including title, but including stanza breaks), and they must be in English.
- Poems must be previously unpublished. The poets retain sole copyright of their poems.
- Prizes will be presented by Bar Sagi's family. The winning poets will read their poems at a prize-giving ceremony held by Voices Israel. This is held in conjunction with the Voices Israel adult's prize in the Reuben Rose competition.
- The winning poems and honorable mention poems will be published in the annual Voices Israel Anthology. Upon acceptance, a parent or legal guardian must sign a release allowing us to publish the poem.
