I hope you are all managing to enjoy Chanukkah with your families despite the newest addition to the Corona alphabet and the resulting restrictions. Here in Voices Israel, we do at least have some happier news:

First: Elana Dorfman is our new Events Coordinator — a warm welcome to her! We all know Elana from the workshops she has given; she'll be in charge of the organization of future workshops and any other events we organize and will help me with other national events such as the competition prize-giving and the anthology launch. Second: **the submission period for the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize is now open.** Please everyone do remind all your family, friends and anyone with teenage children who may be interested, and direct them to the information on the Bar Sagi Prize page of our website: <a href="https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize">https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize</a>. This year we're reverting to the original format of the competition – it is open to Israeli students only. (Prof. Joseph, our generous prize sponsor, has informed me that he is hoping to open a separate competition for overseas students).

Simultaneously, the submission period for the Reuben Rose competition closed this month and the judges are now busy judging the over-300 entries that we received. Because submissions closed a month later than usual, the Anthology submission period has also been moved forward a month. It will open on January 15<sup>th</sup> and run till April 15<sup>th</sup>.

As you may know, we change the panel of judges for the Anthology every two years, so our Chief Editor, Dina, has been looking for three new judges. Our new team is Eli Ben-Joseph, Wendy Blumfield and once again Elana Dorfman who has taken on this role in addition to the events coordination. Many thanks to you all! Many thanks also to our previous judges, Edit Gavriely, Yehudit Goldfarb and David Silverman, who may now take a well-earned rest from the job of reading and judging the over 300 poems that the Anthology also receives in a typical year.

The workshop scheduled to be given on November 23<sup>rd</sup> by Dr. Judy Belsky unhappily had to be postponed for medical reasons; Judy Belsky hopes to give it at a later date. We wish her all the best and a speedy return to full activities!

To end, again, on a happier note: as reported in last month's newsletter: this month Dina Yehuda and I will give a 2-hour Zoom workshop about writing poetry to the TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) students of Givat Washington College, a teacher-training institute near Ashdod. This is a wonderful opportunity to publicize our existence, and that of the Bar Sagi Prize, to those who in a year's time will be teaching English to Israeli high-school students.

## The Voices Israel Group of Poets in English announces the Third Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize Competition, 2022

The Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize commemorates a talented young Israeli poet, Bar Sagi, who died at the age of fifteen. The competition was established by Bar's family and is administered by the Voices Israel Group of Poets in English in consultation with Prof. Anthony Joseph, Bar's grandfather.

The competition is open to Israeli school students aged 12 through 19.

Submission dates: November 15, 2021, through January 15, 2022.

**Cash prizes will be awarded** to three winning poems: 400 NIS first prize, 250 NIS second prize, 100 NIS third prize. One or more other poems may be awarded an Honorable Mention.

There is no fee for entering the competition.

## Competition rules and submission guidelines

- The competition is open to young poets aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written.
- Poets may use their whole name, first name, or a pseudonym. We will not publish any contact information.
- Poets submit by sending up to three poems, by email, in one file either in the body of the email, or as an attached Word file to barsagivoices@gmail.com.
- The parent or guardian's name and postal address, and the child's age when the poems were written, must be included somewhere within the document.
- Poems may be in any style and on any subject, but each must have no more than 41 lines (not including title), and they must be in English.
- Poems must be previously unpublished. The poets retain sole copyright of their poems.
- Prizes will be presented by Bar Sagi's family, and the winning poets will read their poems, at a prize-giving ceremony held by Voices Israel. This may be held separately, or together with the prize-giving for the Reuben Rose competition, Voices Israel's annual poetry competition for adults.
- The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if there are any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology. Upon acceptance, a parent or legal guardian must sign a release allowing us to publish the poem.
