# **LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Dear Poets.

November saw the opening of the submission period for the **Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize** and I'm happy to say that we've already had a few submissions. Our new competition administrator, Michele Bustin, who is herself a retired English teacher, has been networking hard to "spread the word" among her many contacts, and we have high hopes that this year we'll get considerably more entries than we did last year. But we still need your help! So if you know any English teachers – your children's or grandchildren's; former or current colleagues; friends — please do suggest it to them. Our announcement and the guidelines can be downloaded from the Voices Israel website (https://www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize).

Also in November: our last workshop of the calendar year took place in Haifa on November 24<sup>th</sup>, at the home of our workshop coordinator, Elana Dorfman. At one point we had 29 people registered to attend! – but many dropped out en route, several from illness very near the date, so that we ended up with 18, which was just the right number to avoid overcrowding and ensure an enjoyable experience! After a warm-up exercise from Elana, Iris Dan guided us on producing poetry from the conflict of opposites, and Wendy Blumfield on doing the same from dreams. Many thanks to Elana for organizing and coordinating the event *and* providing the venue! As usual, Yochanan Zaqantov is providing an online feedback form which Elana will invite all attendees to fill out.

And, also as usual, we'll be producing a chapbook of the workshop; all attendees who would like edited versions of the poems produced or started at the workshop to appear in the chapbook, please send your poems to me (a maximum of one poem per session) at <a href="mailto:president.voices@gmail.com">president.voices@gmail.com</a>, by mid-December.

The next item on our agenda will be the announcement of the winners and Honourable Mention recipients of the Reuben Rose Competition. The judges are in the throes of judging the last batch of poems, and once they've reached a decision, the competition administrator, Mark Levinson, will announce the results. Hopefully that will be in the first half of December. Remember that up to three of the poems that didn't win a prize or Honourable Mention in the Reuben Rose competition (or of course any other poems, up to three in all) can then be entered for the 2023 Anthology, whose submission period opens in mid-December. When the submission period starts, a Submit button will appear on the Submitting To The Anthology page of our website (https://www.voicesisrael.com/submitting-to-the-anthology).

Looking ahead to 2023: our energetic Workshop Coordinator, Elana Dorfman, is dreaming up more workshops in different venues. If you have a suggestion for a subject you'd like a presentation on, or one you yourself could give a presentation on, or a presenter (member or not) whom you'd like us to invite to give one – please contact Elana (elanado@gmail.com).



The poems in this collection are like pearls set on a silver necklace: each gleaming in its own right but enhanced by its setting. ## THE BAR SAGI YOUNG POETS PRIZE

Bar Sagi was a young Israeli poet who wrote in English. Born in Rehovot in 2001, she lived from age five to eleven with her parents in the United States and English became her preferred language. Sadly, on her return to Israel she was diagnosed with bone cancer, and after putting up a courageous and protracted battle, finally succumbed in 2017 after over four years, before reaching her sixteenth birthday.

During these last years, Bar wrote 25 poems which documented her journey with illness and hope and her remarkable life force. These poems, written in her own hand-illustrated book entitled "See Me Soar and Spread My Wings," reflect her many-sided character and unusually mature understanding. The publishing house Gvanim has published them in a book, illustrated with original water-colourings mostly by Ellie Makar-Limanov with others by Anna Melnikov (available from Steimatsky). In addition, the Israeli Education Ministry has selected six of them to be taught in Israeli schools: these can be freely viewed and the file downloaded at

https://meyda.education.gov.il/files/Pop/Ofiles/english/Chativat-Beynayim/Selected\_Poems\_of\_Bar\_Sagi.pdf.

Bar's family decided to endow a prize in her name, to preserve her memory and to encourage other young poets. Voices Israel is delighted to partner with them in this initiative, and to help encourage the voices of the young in Israel.

The competition is open to Israelis aged 12 to 19 when the poem was written. Full submission rules and guidelines are at www.voicesisrael.com/bar-sagi-prize-guidelines.

The competition is free to enter, and awards three cash prizes (First Prize: 400 NIS; Second Prize: 250 NIS; Third Prize: 100 NIS) plus a variable number of Honorable Mentions at the judges' discretion. The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if there are any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology.

The fourth Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize opened for submissions on November 15, 2022, and will remain open until the end of February 2023.
