LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets.

Shana tova and chag sameach yet again! I hope all of you are enjoying Succot and will find the time during chol ha-mo'ed to write more poetry and try your luck with submissions \odot . Especially to our Reuben Rose competition, which closes on October 10th, Real Soon Now. Submit your best poems for a chance to win one of our newly increased prizes or an Honourable Mention!

On a more sombre note: it happens now and then (and happened again last week) that a scammer gets to our website, copies the email addresses of our officers listed there, and sends requests for help or money (the former always turns into the latter) purporting to be from the President to everyone else. Please note: this does NOT mean my email address has been hacked! The scammer is not sending from it but from a different one. Always check the address such a mail is coming from. In this case the address wasn't remotely like your President's; more sophisticated scammers open a gmail account that is as close as possible to the one they're trying to impersonate, such as presidentvoices@gmail.com without the dot between "president" and "voices", or voicespresident... etc. etc. If it isn't exactly president.voices@gmail.com, it isn't coming from me. The bottom line: don't hit Reply to such messages, they will never be for-real. And check for logic – e.g. this latest message, asking for "urgent help" with a "project", was sent on Yom Kippur and its English wasn't exactly native . Or if it's asking directly for money: your President would never send a request concerning money to anyone but your Treasurer. It's a pity to be worried by these scams: let's all just get into the habit of checking the sender's email address etc. (If you're on your phone and can't see the sender's address, just don't reply).

Back to happier things! We have two events coming up in October:

THE REUBEN ROSE MEMORIAL POETRY COMPETITION

The 34th annual Reuben Rose Memorial Poetry Competition is open for entries until 10 October 2023.

First prize has been increased to \$750, second prize to \$250, and third prize to \$100. The entry fees have been increased by a smaller factor — to \$8 for submitting one poem, or \$16 for submitting three, or \$24 for submitting six.

As before, there will be ten honorable mentions. Among the thirteen winners, no poet will be included twice. All prizewinners and honorable mentions will be published in the coming year's Voices Israel poetry anthology.

Judges are award-winning poet, novelist, and essayist Nancy Shiffrin; Iris Dan, last year's winner of first prize; and David Silverman, last year's winner of second prize. The contest is open to everyone in the world.

Submit original poetry, in English, on any topic. Challenging, humorous, and/or eccentric poetry is welcome, but typographical tricks are discouraged and any illustrations will be discarded. Line limit per poem: 41 lines, including any stanza breaks, dedication, epigraph, etc., but not including the title. Exceptionally lengthy lines count as more than one line.

Poems must be unpublished and must remain unpublished until the list of winners is e-mailed to the entrants. (Target date is December.) Thereafter you may publish and republish as you like; copyright remains with you, and Voices Israel claims only a non-exclusive license to publish and republish the winning poems and honorable mentions in any form, physical or digital. For this competition, poems are not considered previously published if they have appeared in the monthly Voices Israel newsletter or in a Voices Israel workshop chapbook.

Poems are judged without the poets' names. The judges' decision is not subject to appeal. Make sure that your name appears only on the online entry form, not anywhere in the file you send or in the file's name.

CALLS FOR SUBMISSIONS

The Rattle Ekphrastic Challenge is a monthly online feature of Rattle Magazine. There's a long tradition of poetry responding to visual art (and vice versa), and we thought it would be fun to post a challenge. Every month, Rattle posts an image of a piece of art, and poets are invited to submit poems relating to that piece. Each month, two winners—one chosen by the artist and the other by Rattle's editor—receive online publication along with a prize of \$100 each. There is no fee to submit. The deadline is the last day of each month. Details are at www.rattle.com/ekphrastic/.

The Amilcare Solferini International Poetry Contest, based in Italy but open to poets all over the world, is now open. Submit one poem of up to 20 lines, in English, on any topic. There is no fee to submit. The deadline is April 28, 2024. Winners will be notified in May 2024 and the winning poems will be published online. Does It Have Pockets? is a monthly online literary journal. Submit three to five poems in one document. Previously published poems are accepted. There is no deadline. The submission fee is \$3. Upon acceptance, they pay \$10 per group of poems. Details are at www.doesithavepockets.com/subs.

The Poeming Pigeon is an annual print poetry journal from The Poetry Box in Portland, Oregon. Submit one to three poems on any topic. We enjoy poems of all styles: formal, free-verse, metered, non-rhyming, experimental, nostalgic, political, erotic, abstract, lyrical, etc. The deadline for submission is November 15. The fee to submit is \$5. All contributors will be able to order a copy of the journal at an extra-special discount. Guidelines are at https://thepoetrybox.com/the-poeming-pigeon.

Only Poems is a new online weekly poetry site. They say "We publish poets (as opposed to poems). We would like to spend time with your voice and see your range." In practice, this means that every Sunday they publish several poems by one selected poet. They are open for submissions the first seven days of every month. Submit up to 10 pages of poetry. There is no fee to submit. They generally respond within two weeks, and they pay \$55 to accepted poets. Complete guidelines are at www.onlypoems.net/submit.

Portland Review is an online journal produced by the graduate students in the English Department of Portland State University in Portland, Oregon. They publish one new piece on their website each week. Submit up to three poems with a total length of no more than ten pages. There is no submission fee. Deadline is October 20. Guidelines are at https://portlandreview.org/submit/.

Verklempt! is a quarterly printed Magazine of Jewish Art and Literature produced by Havura, a collective of young Jewish artists, painters, writers, poets, musicians, filmmakers, photographers, and creative souls of all kinds in New York City. The theme of their next issue is Seuda. A Seudah is not just about the food — it's also about everything surrounding the food. What we wear. What we talk about. How we set the table. Who should sit next to who, and so on. We are seeking submissions that contemplate these ideas related to Seudah, with the care and nuance they necessitate. Submitters are encouraged to approach the theme from any angle they wish. Submit up to three poems, no word limit. There is no submission fee. Deadline is October 15. Guidelines are at www.havurah.art/seudah.

The Passionfruit Poetry Prize 2023 is open for submissions. The theme is love — and it's yours to interpret as broadly, as interestingly, and as tenuously as you wish. Submit up to three poems of up to 40 lines each. First prize is £100; second prize is £50. The judge of the competition is Amlanjyoti Goswami. In addition to the two prize-winners, the judge will also select up to 20 commended entries to be published in a special issue of *The Passionfruit Review*. Deadline is 31 October.
