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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets.

How peaceful, how innocent were these President's Letters up until this month. How totally inconsequential they seem now! Who could have imagined the horror that would be unleashed on us three weeks ago? Before October 7, we were a group of people with widely divergent political opinions, united only in a passion for poetry; after it, we are a people standing together, despite the shock and the grief.

We grieve for our friends and relatives who were killed, or lost people, in the ferocious attack; we are filled with anxiety for the hostages (including most probably our member Judih Weinstein and her husband, officially stilled defined as "missing") and for all those now in battle in Gaza or prepared to enter it (including the son, Matthew, of our award-winning member, David Silverman of Illinois). I'm sure we are all doing what we can to help the tens, perhaps hundreds of thousands of Israelis evacuated from the south, and from the border regions of the north. And we are determined to carry on life "as normal," as far as possible.

In that spirit: when the "Fern Hill" workshop planned for October 18th had to be cancelled (its presenter Eli Ben-Joseph having had to move from Nahariyya), our indomitable workshop coordinator Elana, and our anthology chief editor Dina Yehuda, gave another on the same date, tailored for the times: "Write at this Moment," encouraging everyone to explore the range of emotions we're all feeling and to concentrate on the positive. Nineteen people attended; several noted how much this coming together, even though just by Zoom, had helped them. As usual we'll produce an echapbook of poems started at that workshop: **please send them to me by November 10**th.

And in the same spirit, we decided to hold the Anthology launch event on October 23rd as planned, but as a Zoom-only rather than hybrid event. I was sorry to cancel the room at the Stage Karaoke Bar, whose staff were incredibly helpful, especially when I went down to Netanya to check that they had all the equipment needed for a hybrid event, and it would work with my computer – but I'm sure we'll have other occasions to celebrate there. 55 people registered, including a dozen non-member contributors to the Anthology; almost all attended and after observing a minute of silence for the victims of the tragedy, the event proceeded "as normal." Dina gave an overview and 37 poets read (or had proxy-read) one poem each.

We're planning another Zoom mini-workshop for December 4th at 7 pm, to be given by Iris Dan: there should be a fuller announcement in this newsletter. **Save the date**!

Reminder: the submission period for the Bar Sagi Prize opens on November 15th; its administrator Michele Bustin is busy getting the word out to her network of teachers. **Please everyone who has any connection to English teacher or to teenagers who might want to enter, get the word out too!** It's open till the end of February 2024. And the 2024 Anthology submission period usually opens on December 15th, but since that's both the last day of Chanukah and erev Shabbat, we'll probably choose December 17th this year.

We still have no Publicity Officer. I'm therefore appealing to all our members: please publicize our events – e.g. now, the Bar Sagi Prize – in your Facebook pages, blogs, and other social media accounts. Spread the word!



Judih Weinstein, an active member of the Voices Israel Southern Group, and her husband Gad Haggai are residents of Kibbutz Nir Oz. Judih and Gad went on an early morning walk near the kibbutz on October 7. Judih called kibbutz paramedics and reported that they had been shot by terrorists on a motorcycle and that Gad was badly wounded. They have not been heard from since and are presumed kidnapped in Gaza.


DEFENDERS OF ISRAEL
