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## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

Since my last President's Letter I've tried to keep updated about our Southern Group member, Judih Weinstein, and her husband Gad Haggai. Both were wounded in the Hamas attack, Gad seriously. At first they were both declared missing, then Gad was said to have been taken hostage. Recently a November 28<sup>th</sup> news article (<a href="https://www.thedailybeast.com/no-americans-among-12-hamas-hostages-released-to-israel-from-gaza-on-tuesday">https://www.thedailybeast.com/no-americans-among-12-hamas-hostages-released-to-israel-from-gaza-on-tuesday</a>) said that Judih was one of two American women the US counted as among the hostages and were trying to get information about from Hamas, and a CBC news article from November 29 (Judith holds joint Canadian and US citizenship) reported (<a href="https://www.cbc.ca/news/world/weinstein-haggai-canadian-hamas-hostage-1.7043397">https://www.cbc.ca/news/world/weinstein-haggai-canadian-hamas-hostage-1.7043397</a>) that her family fear Gad is probably dead, and Judih's whereabouts are unknown. While rejoicing for the hostages who have returned to us, we continue to hope and pray for her safety.

Other news: our secretary, Pesach Rotem, will be "retiring" at the next AGM. And we've decided it's time to separate the functions of secretary and newsletter producer, which call for two quite different skill sets that it isn't always easy to find in one person. Our long-term member **Bob Findysz** from the Jerusalem group has volunteered to take over as our next secretary. This has to be formally approved by a vote at the AGM, but meanwhile Bob will start to "learn the ropes" from Pesach. And our relatively new but very active member, **Julian Alper** from Tiberias, has enthusiastically agreed to take on on the newly-created position of Newsletter Editor. Julian is perhaps best known for his Nature of Israel blog (<a href="https://natureofisrael.blogspot.com/">https://natureofisrael.blogspot.com/</a>). Like Bob, he'll overlap with Pesach for two or three months. We extend a warm welcome to both of them, and much as I lament losing Pesach as secretary, I look forward to working with his successors.

The judging of the Reuben Rose competition is still ongoing; Mark will announce the results as soon as they're known. Meanwhile the submission period for the 2024 Anthology opens on December 17<sup>th</sup>. As usual it will run for three months. So if none of the poems you submitted to the Reuben Rose competition won a prize or Honourable Mention, submit the best three of them to the Anthology!

On December 4<sup>th</sup> we're offering another Zoom mini-workshop, "Broken Things," led by last year's Reuben Rose first-prize winner, Iris Dan. If anyone didn't yet sign up and wants to: now is your last chance! See the notice in the last newsletter and no doubt also in this one.

The chapbook from our October 18 workshop, "Write At This Moment," has been produced and sent to all participants. If anyone attended that workshop and didn't get their copy, do let me know!

The submission period for the Bar Sagi Prize opened on November 15<sup>th</sup>. Last year's judges have agreed to judge this year too: many thanks to Amiel Schotz, Susan Bell and Itamar Blumfield, and of course to its administrator, Michele Bustin, who is busy publicizing it to her network of English teachers But we need more publicity efforts! Please everyone who has any connection to English teacher or to teenagers who might want to enter, get the word out! It's open till the end of February 2024.

We still have no Publicity Officer. I'm therefore appealing to all our members: please publicize our events – e.g. now, the Bar Sagi Prize – in your Facebook pages, blogs, and other social media accounts. Spread the word!



It is free to enter, and it awards three cash prizes (First Prize: 400 NIS; Second Prize: 250 NIS; Third Prize: 100 NIS) plus a variable number of Honorable Mentions. The winning poems, and Honorable Mention poems if any, will be published in the annual Voices Israel anthology.

#### THE "WRITE AT THIS MOMENT" WORKSHOP AND CHAPBOOK




War is hell. And yet, for all its horrors, war has inspired some of the most sublime poetry in the world. Just look at *The Iliad*, or at David's lament for Saul and Jonathan. And thus it was at the Voices Israel "Write at This Moment" workshop on October 18. Under the skillful guidance of workshop leaders Elana Dorfman and Dina Yehuda, nineteen participants worked through the range of emotions arising from the brutal Hamas attack on Israel and the ensuing war, and channeled them into poetry. After some tweaking and polishing by the poets, the final drafts – many of them quite excellent poems – were collected in a chapbook, expertly curated and beautifully designed by Judy Koren.

They pay \$50 per page of poetry. There is a \$2 submission fee for poets in the U.S.A., no submission fee for Canada and the rest of the world. The deadline for submissions is December 31. The Wild Umbrella is a new Irish literary journal that just got started in October. It is online only for now, but hopes to publish a print issue some time in the spring or summer of 2024. We're an ambitious new journal, eager to publish compelling prose and poetry from Ireland and the world. Submit one to six poems of any length. Submissions are free, but a donation of €10 will entitle you to an expedited response within 10 working days. Contributors will receive €10 per poem. Submission deadline is January 1, 2024. **Table/Feast Literary Magazine** is an annual online journal of poetry, fiction, and creative nonfiction. *We are not a food magazine or recipe outlet.* Submit up to five poems.
