LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

We are continuing to prepare the memorial chapbook for our member Judih Weinstein Haggai z"l, who was killed in the October 7th attack together with her husband Gad Haggai z"l. Along with some of Judih's poems, we plan to have a section of memorial poems for her, and a section of poems by members that "echo" or "respond to" one of hers. We put out a call for poems for both those sections in early February, and a reminder a week ago, with a deadline of end-of-month. That deadline has now passed, but if you have a poem in preparation and can send it in within the next few days, please do! – to any or all of the co-editors: myself (president.voices@gmail.com), Miriam Green (miriamsgreen@gmail.com) and Dina Yehuda (bestdj@gmail.com).

Our Global Group is full and we're opening a second one: GG2. It already has 9 members registered! It's limited to members who don't attend any other group, with preference given to our overseas members if it too fills up. Details are in the Meetings list in this newsletter.

The submission period for the Voices Israel Anthology is still open – until March 17th inclusive, Israel time. So if you haven't done so already, please choose your 3 best unpublished poems and send them in! And of course any poems you submitted to the Reuben Rose competition that didn't win one of those top 13 slots, can now be submitted for the Anthology, provided it has remained unpublished.

The submission period for the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize, however, has just closed. Judging has been ongoing so I expect our administrator, Michele Bustin, will be able to announce the results within a couple of weeks.

The results of the Reuben Rose Competition have been announced to all members and entrants, and the texts of the top 13 poems are up on the website: go to https://voicesisrael.com/2023-reuben-rose-competition/ and click on the link at the bottom of that page (PDF file).

Our Annual General Meeting (AGM) will also be held via Zoom this year, at 7 pm on Sunday April 7th, and as usual will end with an Open Mic. We hope to get many more participants than we do when it's in-person! At the AGM we'll be voting on the nomination of Bob Findysz as Secretary to replace Pesach, and on a resolution I'm proposing to adopt general guidelines for group meetings.

The awards events for both the Reuben Rose Competition and the Bar Sagi Prize will be held together via Zoom a week later, on Sunday April 14th at 7 pm. **Save the date!** If there's time we'll hold an Open Mic at the end of this event too. (Please don't read the same poem at both events \bigcirc). We'll send out an email notice to you all when registration for each of these two events starts.

We still have no Publicity Officer. I'm therefore appealing to all our members: please publicize our events – e.g. now, the Voices Israel Anthology submission periods – in your Facebook pages, blogs, and other social media accounts. Spread the word!



Five poets from the Voices Israel Haifa group were guest poets launching an open mic for the Haifa branch of ESRA (English Speaking Residents Association) at the beginning of February. They were Judy Koren, Wendy Blumfield, Iris Dan, Naomi Yalin, Elana Dorfman. Each read one thoughtful serious poem, most referring to the war situation, and then chose poems in a lighter vein to give the audience an uplift. Peter Halpern, a new member of Haifa Voices, also read a poem and this was followed by musical items, songs of the 60's that are still relevant and protest songs that could have been written today. The proceeds of ESRA events are used for community projects, helping disadvantaged children and at this time giving extra help to evacuated families.

Helen Bar-Lev is an artist and a poet, currently living in Karmiel after being evacuated from Metulla, where she has been living for the past 16 years.

"Jerusalem is the center of Helen Bar-Lev's universe. In Spirit Captive, she explores — through poetry, prose, and painting — every aspect of her decades-long love affair with the holy city. It is an intense relationship, replete with faith and despair, break-ups and reunions, danger and beauty, passion and obsession and escape. Bar-Lev's remarkable gifts make it all come alive." This evening we will meet Helen in person and she will introduce us to her new book. Copies will be available for purchase for NIS 40 (cash or bit).

Helen Bar-Lev was born in New York City and arrived in Israel after High School in 1959 with a scholarship to study at the Haim Greenberg Teachers' Institute in the Ba'aka neighborhood of Jerusalem.

In 1963 she was accepted to study art at the Cooper Union School for Art and Architecture, and finally graduated with a B.A. in anthropology.

In 1973 she made Aliyah with her family and within the year the beauty of the landscape helped her again to focus on art.

She has lived in Rehovot and Tsfat but the most colorful, memorable phase of her life were the years she spent in Jerusalem.

In 2004 she began writing poetry and has won many accolades for her art and poetry.

CALLS FOR SUBMISSIONS

Prosopisia—the Biannual International Journal of Poetry and Creative Writing, is the flagship print publication of the The Academy of Writers And World Literati (ARAWLII). The aim of the Academy is *to promote creative writing in English in particular through bringing together poets and writers from all over the world on a single participatory platform and, thus, strengthen the cultural and literary ties which bind India with other countries.* Prosopisia is open for submissions for its upcoming issue until March 23. There is no submission fee. Details are at www.arawlii.com/Announcements.aspx.

The Pablo Neruda Prize for Poetry is administered by the Nimrod International Journal of Prose and Poetry at the University of Tulsa in Oklahoma. First prize is \$2,000 plus publication. Second prize is \$1,000 plus publication. Finalists and semi-finalists will also be published and will be paid at Nimrod's standard publication rate of \$10 per page. Submit 3 to 10 pages of poetry before the deadline of April 1. Submission fee is \$23. Details are at https://nimrod.utulsa.edu/nimrod-literary-awards/

The Frontier Poetry Nature & Place Prize is open for submissions. The first-place winner will receive \$3,000 and publication. Second- and third-place winners will receive \$300 and \$200 respectively, as well as publication. *We're looking for poems rich and robust in language, technique, and form that pay homage to the natural world and all of the small marvels that occur in nature. We're also interested in poems that observe geography and the landscape of home.* Submit up to three poems, up to five pages total. Deadline is April 28. Submission fee is \$20. Details at https://www.frontierpoetry.com/poetry-awards/.

Bacopa Literary Review, the annual print journal of the Writers Alliance of Gainesville, will be awarding a \$200 Award and a \$100 Honorable Mention in each of six categories: fiction, flash fiction, creative nonfiction, formal poetry, free verse poetry, and visual poetry. The submission period is from March 4 through April 4. Submission details are at https://writersallianceofgainesville.submittable.com/submit.

The Penn Review has been published at the University of Pennsylvania since 1951. *We publish biannual online issues: the Winter Issue and the Spring Issue. Additionally, we release an annual print issue each spring that features our favorite pieces from the year.* Submit up to five poems. Deadline is March 17. There is no submission fee. They respond very quickly: usually within two weeks of submission. Details at www.pennreview.org/submit.

The Ilanot Review is a biannual international online journal affiliated with the Shaindy Rudoff Graduate Program in Creative Writing at Bar-Ilan University, Israel. *We strive to create conversations here that could occur nowhere else.* The theme of their upcoming issue is Fixation – Obsessions and Repairs. Submit up to 5 poems, not to exceed 7 pages. Deadline is March 31. Submission fee is \$3. Details at www.ilanotreview.com/submissions-page/.

Red Door is an online and print quarterly arts-and-culture magazine based in Copenhagen, Denmark. The theme for their upcoming edition is "Truth and the Paradox." *Our themes are always open to far-fetched interpretations and are not limited to a narrow definition.* Submit up to 3 poems (up to 50 lines each) and up to 6 pages. The deadline is April 26. Submission fee is \$3. Details are at https://redpress.submittable.com/submit.
