LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

Purim has come and gone in the shadow of the continually stymied efforts to achieve the release of our hostages in Gaza. I hope that despite the times, we, and especially our children/grandchildren, have been able to celebrate the downfall of Haman and to see in it a foreshadowing of the downfall of those in the present day who rise up against us.

Meanwhile we just carry on. Our Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held via Zoom in a week's time, at 7 pm on Sunday April 7th, and as usual will end with an Open Mic. We'll be voting on the nominations of Bob Findysz to replace Pesach as Secretary, and Julian Alper to replace me as President (effective from July), and on two resolutions, one of them concerning the adoption of general guidelines for group meetings. So if you'd like to hear what all the different sections of Voices Israel have been doing over the year, and have a say in how we run the society, **and didn't yet register**, you still can, **in the next few days only**, via the form at https://forms.gle/mrc9RWEAuyzNp3zW7. Results of the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize have been announced. For the first time, we have two Druze school students among the winners: the First Prize winner and an Honorable Mention winner. I and the prize administrator, Michele Bustin, are so happy that the competition has come to the attention of a wider section of our Israeli community. The awards event for the Reuben Rose Competition and the Bar Sagi Prize will be held together via Zoom on Sunday April 14th at 7 pm. **Please register for this event (again, IF you haven't yet)** via the registration form at <u>https://forms.gle/koRE4CWFyFbJUTN58</u>. If you can, please attend from the start, to support our young poets-in-the-making. If time there will be an Open Mic at the end of this event too.

In mid-March we held the first meeting of our new second global group (GG2), with nine members, and requests to join still being received, so it's well on the way to being one of our bigger groups. There are still a few places in it for members, especially those from abroad, who don't belong to any other group.

The submission period for our Anthology has just ended, with over 50 poems submitted in the extension time after the original March 17th closing date. The judges and Dina, the Anthology editor, are now busy making their final selections. We expect to have the Anthology ready for printing in July and to be able to distribute it in early or mid-August, as usual.

Preparation of our memorial chapbook for Judih Weinstein Haggai z"l is also well underway. Thanks to all of you who sent in poems for it.

Finally: responses show a clear preference for holding the overnight Netanya residential workshop, rather than two one-day ones, so we're continuing to plan in that direction. In a couple of weeks we expect to be able to put out a program, and a registration form for actually signing up to come.

I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at our two national events this coming month. And as usual: please publicize our events in your Facebook pages, blogs, and other social media accounts. Spread the word!

CALLS FOR SUBMISSIONS

The /tEmz/ Review is a quarterly online literary journal based in London, Ontario, Canada. Submit one to eight poems, preferably not exceeding ten pages in total length. *Our preference is for innovative verse that pushes the boundaries of poetry, but we are open to a wide range of styles and voices.* There is no submission fee. Deadline is April 30. They pay \$20 per batch of poems they publish. Complete guidelines are at www.thetemzreview.com/submissions.html.

The 2024 RockPaperPoem Poetry Prize will award a Grand Prize of \$250 and two Runners-Up of \$100 each. Submit one to three of your best, previously unpublished poems. Entry fee is \$10. Deadline is May 31. Guidelines are at https://rockpaperpoem.com/2024-RockPaperPoem-Poetry-Prize.html.

Witcraft is an online publication that bills itself as "the home of skillful writing that is brief, humorous and engaging, with the emphasis on wit, word play, absurdity and inspired nonsense." It publishes one piece — fiction, nonfiction, or poetry — on its site every day. All submissions accepted for publication are automatically eligible for one of three prizes for the month submitted: First prize AU\$50, second prize AU\$20, third prize AU\$10. Abandoned Mine is a poetry journal based in Albuquerque, New Mexico that publishes online triannually plus a selected annual print edition. They are looking for: *Poems that are accessible and understandable. Poems people will want to re-read. Poems people will want to share with family and friends, neighbors and co-workers.* Submit up to four poems. Deadline is May 15. Submit by snail mail only. Cæsura is a publication of Poetry Center San José. In 2024, they will publish two unique versions of Cæsura, a print version and an online version, both with the theme of Neighborhood. *Neighborhood, is it a location, a culture, or a state of mind? We aren't looking for the word neighborhood, we're looking for your vision; enchanting, humorous, or rebellious.* Submit up to three literary works. *We are partial to poems of 32 lines or fewer but make exceptions for longer poems that are too good to pass up.* There is no submission fee. Harbor Review is a semiannual online journal of poetry and visual art. *We are interested in strange and beautiful language, image, and metaphor*. The theme for their upcoming summer issue is "Wondrous & Miraculous." You may interpret this theme however you like. Submit one to three poems. Submissions are free. They pay \$10 for each published poem. Deadline is April 30. Guidelines are at www.harbor-review.com/submit.

Mezzo Cammin is a semiannual web journal devoted to formal poetry by women. Mezzo Cammin welcomes submissions of poetry that pays particular consideration to form. Submit two to six poems. *Poems in structured forms are especially welcome, but poems that use form in interesting and experimental ways are also encouraged.* There is no submission fee. Deadline is June 30. Submission guidelines are at www.mezzocammin.com.

Rhino is an annual print literary journal. Submit three to five poems. *We welcome all styles of writing, particularly that which is well-crafted, uses language lovingly and surprisingly, and feels daring or quietly powerful.* There is no submission fee. Submission deadline is June 30 or until monthly caps are reached. Accepted poets will receive one copy of the issue featuring their poem, and the opportunity to purchase additional copies at a discount.
