LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Poets,

As we celebrated Pesach, the festival of freedom, this past month, our hearts remained with our hostages in Gaza. Let's hope that the current negotiations do at long last result in an agreement to free them.

Since Pesach took up most of the second half of April, and national festivals mark the first two weeks of May, our usual April-May events were compressed this year into the first two weeks of April. So we held our AGM (Annual General Meeting) on April 7th and the awards ceremonies for the Bar Sagi and Reuben Rose prizes on April 14th, both via Zoom. This was the first time we held the AGM by Zoom, and it resulted as expected in a larger attendance (20 people versus the usual dozen or so when held in person). It was an important meeting: our long-term member Bob Findysz of Jerusalem was voted in to replace Pesach Rotem who's stepped down as Secretary; our newer and very welcome member Julian Alper of Tiberias was appointed President Elect, to replace me as President when I finish my 4-year term at the end of June; and members overwhelmingly voted to accept a short set of Guidelines for the monthly group meetings, to be used as local coordinators see fit. The Guidelines as adopted by the AGM are in this newsletter. Congratulations to both Bob and Julian! Bob has now quietly and efficiently taken over from Pesach, and can be reached at the regular email address for our Secretary (secretary.voices@gmail.com). Julian, apart from being President-Elect, has taken over the role of Newsletter editor, and everything connected with the Newsletter (notices to be included in it, poems chosen at group meetings, etc. etc.) should be sent to him at the new email address newsletter.voices@gmail.com. Many thanks, Julian, for taking on this new role as well as your future one!

For the Bar Sagi Young Poets Prize and Reuben Rose Competition awards event the following week, we had over 50 participants, about the same as last year. We were sorry that our Bar Sagi Prize sponsor, Prof. Anthony Joseph, was at the last moment unable to be with us, but happy to see that news of our competition has reached a wider variety of schools and we had two Druze students among the prize and Honourable Mention winners. Since the event was held by Zoom, we had many participants from abroad. Only three Honourable Mention winners couldn't make it: many thanks to our members who proxy-read their poems for them.

Looking ahead: registration for the Netanya Residential Workshop on May 20-21st has been picking up and we have 23 members registered to attend, plus three accompanying spouses. So we're confirming to the hotel that we're going ahead and asking them to reserve rooms for those who've registered. It's an exciting program: many thanks to Elana our Workshop Coordinator for organizing it! If you haven't registered but would like to come: last chance! And finally: Anthology judging is nearly finished; and we've also nearly finished preparing the memorial chapbook for Judih Weinstein Haggai z"l. Thanks to all of you who sent in poems for both of them.

GUIDELINES FOR VOICES ISRAEL MEETINGS

adopted at the 2024 AGM

- Voices welcomes poets at every stage, including those who are only just starting to write poetry. We don't have any
 sort of exam to determine if someone is "good enough" to join. We believe that all of us, whether award-winning poets
 or just starting out, can learn from each other.
- The purpose of the group is to offer each member gentle, helpful critique in order to help them improve their poem. We do not phrase it as negative criticism, and we try to avoid remarks which may be hurtful or reflect negatively on the poet, always keeping in mind that the aim is to help the poet improve their writing in a pleasant and comfortable environment. We aren't here to say "that poem is no good" but rather "here's how I think you could make it better."
- People are encouraged to bring works in progress, or poems they're having a hard time with -- the least polished poems are the ones that can most benefit from gentle, positive critique. We all want to bring finished poems and hope to hear praise of them, but bringing *only* poems we consider "finished" rather defeats the purpose of the exercise.
- Our critique is preferably addressed to specific aspects of the poem. If we think it's wonderful, we say what in our opinion makes it so. If we think it's not so good, we point out the specific things that we think could be improved, and say why or *optimally* suggest a possible improvement. If we can't do either of those, we don't comment on it.
- We remember that everyone has a different style and writes different types of poetry (rhyming, metrical, free verse, prose poem, formal such as haiku or villanelle, plain-speaking versus allusive, etc.), and our own personal preferences for one type over another are not the poem's problem. So we don't comment on the fact that a poem's style or type is not to our taste.
- That said: Voices does not allow poems to espouse racism or sexism or to incite hate against a specific person or group, and the group coordinator is free to decide whether to reject any such poem or whether to bring it to the group.
- Our critiques are just suggestions. Poets are free to accept or decline any suggestion. It may take them time to decide, so "thanks, I'll think about that" is often the best response. The commenter should then accept this and not try to press their point: we try our best *not* to get into arguments between a poet and a commenter regarding why a comment should or should not be accepted.
- Each of our groups has its own way of doing things. But do remember that large groups and/or Zoom groups have to keep things focused on critique of the poems, and not stray into philosophical or political or ethical discussions arising from the content of a poem, because meeting time is limited and such discussions use up the time needed for commenting on the poems. The coordinator, or someone they ask to do so, may need to divide up the available time between the poems to be read, and then keep time and say "time up" or "let's not stray off the poem itself." Group members should take this in good spirit and comply with the request.
